UPSL Academy Handbook for 2024-25



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Bylaws

1. Introduction and Purpose

- a. The United Premier Soccer League (UPSL) is a National Affiliate member of the U.S. Soccer Federation and a designated National League in men's adult amateur soccer. The league is the largest amateur college and pro-development league in the United States with over 500 participating teams across the country.
- b. The purpose of the UPSL Academy Divisions is to provide a pathway for youth players within their existing Clubs into the adult game. The opportunity for youth players in their later teenage years is somewhat lacking in the USA. This is on account of a very shallow professional game which is not developing enough home-grown players, limited available college places and the short college soccer season, and the fragmented adult amateur leagues across the various state associations.

UPSL Academy will allow existing UPSL Men's and Women member teams to enhance their current youth programs, or in some cases start to develop an academy program as a feeder to their adult teams. UPSL Academy will also be open to applications from Clubs which currently do not have an adult program yet are seeking to enhance awareness amongst their players as to the opportunities that exist beyond youth soccer.

- c. UPSL Academy will be competitive level youth soccer organized into conferences around the country which, for the most part, will mirror the conferences that exist in the UPSL adult structure. As with the adults, the UPSL Academy division will operate fall and spring seasons, and will continue its practices of affordability, openness, embracing diversity, and sensible travel requirements.
- d. To qualify for eligibility to UPSL Academy competition the applicant Club must complete the UPSL Academy application process. This can be accessed at upsregistration.com/application.

2. Governance

- a. UPSL Academy competition will be sanctioned by the UPSL.



- b. Participating Clubs including their officials, coaches and players agree to comply with all USSF and UPSL bylaws, rules and policies as may now be in effect or may be instituted in the future, including USSF Bylaw 706.
- c. The administrative authority to represent and conduct the business of UPSL Academy is vested in the Board of Directors (BOD). The BOD is responsible for implementation of the rules, policies and procedures and shall delegate to its officers the day-to-day management.
- d. The BOD shall comprise no fewer than 5 individuals and any decision making that is contested shall be resolved using a vote, the passing of which requires a majority.
- e. The BOD shall be established and composed of the President, Vice-President and three (3) Commissioners.
- f. UPSL Academy is an operating subsidiary of UPSL LLC, a Florida Limited Liability Company. The BOD is required to submit a report to the Chief Operating Officer of UPSL LLC on an annual basis.

3. Duties and Responsibilities of the BOD

- a. Interpret and enforce the bylaws and rules herein.
- b. Enforce any disciplinary action resulting from violations of the Rules.
- c. Review all new club and/or team applications.
- d. Create and implement the operating budget.
- e. Review, amend and approve any changes to these Bylaws and Rules to ensure conformity with USSF requirements.
- f. Ensure sufficient staffing is deployed to achieve smooth and uninterrupted operation off the UPSL Academy competition.
- g. Submit a report to the Chief Operating Officer of UPSL LLC on an annual basis.

4. Duties and Responsibilities of Officers

- a. President.
The President shall: (i) conduct all meetings of the BOD, (ii) serve on any committees formed within UPSL Youth, (iii) give opening remarks at the



AGM, (iv) serve as liaison between UPSL Academy and any governing body (v) designate operational responsibilities throughout UPSL Youth, (vi) review and approve operational budgets.

b. Vice President.

The Vice President shall: (i) serve as a voting member of the BOD, (ii) serve on behalf of the President in the President's absence, (iii) manage all operational programs within UPSL Academy, (iv) ensure compliance of participating teams with rules and regulations, (v) approve any disciplinary actions, (vi) review and sign off on new team approvals, (vii) compose competition formatting, (viii) attend competition finals.

Rules

5. Laws of the Game

- a. All UPSL Academy games will be played according to the current FIFA Laws of the Game except for any exception that may be listed in these rules.
- b. All UPSL Academy games will be officiated by currently certified USSF Referees and Assistant Referees who will be assigned by a registered Referee Assignor.
- c. Unlimited substitutions and re-entry will be allowed during all UPSL Academy games; however, a player substituted in the first half may not re-enter until the second half, and a player substituted in the second half may only re-enter once. Each such team is allowed 5 'substitution moments' per game. Half time does not count as a substitution moment. During a given 'moment' a maximum of 3 eligible players can be subbed-in to the game.
- d. A player substituted for evaluation of a head injury will not count toward the team's total number of allowed substitution moments.
- e. UPSL seasons are spread across the school year (e.g. 2023-24), whilst eligibility is based on birth year (see rule 8i)
- f. No Club will be allowed to play any UPSL Academy game without nine (9) players available to start the game and at least 7 players available for the game to continue once started. If less than 7 players can continue as a result of injury or red cards the game will be stopped and the referee will include that in his/her referee report. The Club with less than the minimum number of players to start will forfeit the game with three (3) goals to the opposing team. The Club with less than 7 players to continue the game will lose the game either 0-3 or the score at the time of the game being stopped, whichever is more favorable to the opposition.



6. Definition of the Season

- a. All playing seasons will have a designated period within which all UPSL Academy games are to be played. All UPSL Academy Clubs will be notified about the Official start date of the season at least four weeks in advance for Clubs to prepare their teams.
- b. The UPSL Academy conducts two seasons within one 12-month period, namely Fall/Winter and Spring/Summer. Each season will comprise of a 'regular season' of league play with conference playoffs and regional playoffs if feasible. Shorter Regional Cup tournaments may also be incorporated.
- c. Teams participating in any UPSL Academy season agree to play an ENTIRE season. This means that it is strictly prohibited for any team to withdraw from the season once placed on the league fixture list. After the fixture list is published, **no refund of season dues can be issued under any circumstances**. All teams must play each scheduled season from beginning to end, and teams not finishing the season will be subject to a \$750 fine with no exceptions.

7. League Structure

- a. UPSL Academy will be organized as four (4) regions with conferences within each region and divisions within each conference. The top tier of competition within each conference will be known as UPSL Academy Premier Division and the next tier will be named UPSL Academy Division 1.
- b. For any division the minimum number of teams will be 4 and the maximum number will be 12. The minimum number of games allowed will be 5 and the maximum 11.
- c. Initially UPSL Academy will operate U17, U15 and U13 divisions and the duration of league play will be:

U13- 35 minutes per half (10min half-time)
U15- 40 minutes per half (10min half-time)

U17- 45 minutes per half (15min half-time)
- d. For all Divisions, the Club which has accumulated the highest number of points at the end of the regular season will be declared the Regular Season Winners of that Division.
- e. If two or more Clubs obtain the same number of points at the end of the regular season, their rankings will be determined as follows in the stated order:



- i. Head-to-head points
- ii. Head-to-head goal difference
- iii. Total goal difference (max of 6 applies per individual game).
- iv. Total goals scored
- v. Greatest away goal in head-to-head.
- vi. In the event of a three-way tie: a mini table involving games between those three respective teams will be used based on the above order.

8. Registrations, Rosters, Transfers

- a. All players and coaches must first be registered with the UPSL, in their legal name, to be eligible to play or coach, using the UPSL registration portal.
- b. For coaches, trainers and any officials who will be present with the youth club at any time, UPSL registration including Safe Sport Certification must be completed. They are issued a UPSL credentials pass which must be displayed in order to occupy the bench area.
- c. The Academy Player Registration fee is twenty-four dollars (\$24) per player per year. One year covers the Fall/Winter Season, and the Spring/Summer Season and after the Spring/Summer season the registration lapses. The fee includes UPSL's secondary player's insurance. An optional player ID card is available for an additional \$13.
- d. The coaches Registration fee is twenty dollars (\$20) plus any background check fee. All coaches, to register, will be required to hold a Concussion Protocol Certificate (SafeSport), and complete a level 2 Background Check. Starting with the 2025-26 season, all coaches will be required to hold a USSF D or United Soccer Coaches Advanced Regional license,
- e. A copy of the player's birth certificate must be uploaded as part of the registration to provide verification of the player's age.
- f. The required player parental consent forms and waivers which must be completed are built into the registration system.
- g. The Academy game day roster is generated in the registration system and then printed by the Club. The Game Day Roster must be used for the roster check on game day. No player may participate without being included on the game day roster at the roster check.
- h. The minimum number of players to be registered for each UPSL Academy



team is 15. Up to 24 players can be nominated for the game day roster, but the maximum allowed to be checked in for a game is 20.

- i. The 2024-2025 season (ending July 31st, 2025) age group eligibility is as follows:

U13- Born on or after 1/1/2012.

U15- Born on or after 1/1/2010.

U17- Born on or after 1/1/2008.

- j. A player may only be registered and participate with one club at any given time within a UPSL Academy season. Player transfers during a year, from one club to another, are allowed if the player is transferred according to UPSL procedures which involves approval from the original club and the payment of an admin fee of \$24.
- k. Players can be transferred from one team to another within their Club if it's within the age limits stated above. Players can temporarily be moved up an age group and back down to their original team without payment of transfer fees.
- l. All registrations and/or transfers must be done before the roster freeze deadline which is the Wednesday that falls within 10 days prior to the weekend of the final regular season scheduled games for that division.
- m. A club that is fielding a men's D1 or Premier team, in addition to an Academy U17 team, is allowed to use Academy players in the men's team temporarily, and move them back down to their Academy team, without payment of transfer fees except that the 1st occasion requires payment of a \$13 fee. This type of movement is not available once any relevant roster freezes are in effect.

9. UPSL Youth Fees and Applications

- a. Annual Membership Fee: To enter a team into UPSL Academy the Club must pay the UPSL annual membership fee. The Club makes only one such payment regardless of the number of teams entered. * See membership benefits below.
- b. Team Season Dues: The cost of entry for each team for each season is \$375. Fees must be received by the stated deadline for the team to be included in the schedule.
- c. Performance Bond: Each Club must deposit a \$500 refundable performance bond which can be used against any fines imposed upon the



- Club during the season including those related to Minimum Standards violations.
- d. The home team is responsible for the expense of providing the field.
 - e. The fees for the match officials are the responsibility of both teams and must be paid the Tuesday by 5pm prior to the weekend game.
 - f. New Clubs wishing to join UPSL Academy must complete the online application form, including the certification form of adherence to the rules, and obtain approval from the UPSL approvals committee.

10. Disciplinary Matters

- a. A Player or Club Official sent off by the referee must leave the field immediately and may not return. If the Player or Club Official refuses to leave within a 5-minute period, the game will be called, and a 3-0 win will be awarded to the opposing team, or the score will stand as is, if preferable to the opposing team. Said Player or Official will serve no less than 6 games for the refusal to leave. If the team Player or Official returns to the team sideline after the ejection, there will be a further penalty of an additional 3 games and a \$100 fine.
- b. A Player dismissed by the referee (i.e. "red carded" or sent off, including dismissal because of two (2) yellow cards given in the same game) will be suspended from the Club's next match. If the Officials' report states a reason other than the double caution, it will be evaluated, and a suspension report will be sent to the team.
- c. Any period of suspension or part thereof which remains outstanding at the end of a season must be served at the commencement of the next season.
- d. Where a Player or Club Official transfers to a new Club during a period of suspension the suspension will transfer to the new Club.
- e. A red card issued to a player or coach carries an automatic and minimum one game suspension which must be served at the next UPSL game whether or not any further suspensions have been decided.
- f. Any player shown a Red Card for the following offenses will be suspended as follows:

Offensive Language: 1-2 games

Offensive Language to Officials: 2-3 games, plus \$100 fine

Serious Foul Play: 1-3 games

Violent Conduct: 2-4 games



Spitting: 4 games

Threatening or Intimidating Language or Behavior to a Match Official: 4 games- season ban, plus \$200 fine

Fighting: 4 games to season ban, plus \$200 fine

Fines are the responsibility of the Club.

- g. Any player or club or team official who insults, castigates, intimidates or threatens a match official or damage the official's personal property before or after the match will be suspended for up to six (6) months for a first offense and one (1) year for a second.
- h. Assault: Any player or Club Official who physically assaults a match official will have a lifetime ban from the UPSL and be reported to the governing body. Assault includes but is not limited to the following acts committed upon a referee: hitting, kicking, punching, choking, spitting on, body checking, head butting or the act of kicking or throwing any object at a referee with force such that it could inflict injury. Additionally, the Club of the player or official will be fined \$500.
- i. Teams are fully responsible for the behavior of their fans including players' parents. This includes, but is not limited to fighting, threatening behavior and verbal abuse. A team's failure to control their fans will result in a possible fine, suspension, game forfeit or even removal from the league without refund.
- j. Any club, Club Official or player which/who commits persistent rule violations, or which, in the opinion of the UPSL Executive Committee, is acting in a manner that is seriously damaging to the UPSL, can be suspended or removed from the UPSL without a notice period or refund. This includes but is not limited to violating the UPSL Code of Conduct, threatening or harassing a League Official and failing to comply with the signed Rules Certification.

11. Game Day Operations

- a. All Clubs are requested to arrive at the venue at least one (1) hour prior to kick-off for pre-match formalities. Breakdown of vehicles and traffic delays will not be considered as unforeseeable circumstances.
- b. Clubs will submit completed game roster to the referee at least thirty (30) minutes prior to the start of the match.



- c. No Player may be added to the Game Roster that was not listed on the initially submitted team roster. Handwritten player entries are strictly prohibited.
- d. Inspection of players commences thirty (30) minutes before kick-off.
- e. No hard casts are permitted by any player in match play. Soft casts are permitted if the match official deems it safe for all players. If during the match, the accepted soft cast is deemed unsafe the game officials have the right to deem it so and the player must be substituted from the match immediately.
- f. Prior to kick-off the match officials and the teams' starting 11s should conduct a walk out to center field and line up facing the spectators.
- g. Any player arriving late is not allowed to start the game once the teams' walk out to center field has commenced. In such an instance, the player can be roster checked at half time and be substituted in thereafter. A player arriving after the second half has kicked off is not allowed to play.
- h. The Coaches and any other technical staff or Club Officials present in the bench area must be listed on the Game Day Roster, checked by the referee, and must be displaying their Club credentials in the form of a UPSL pass card within a lanyard.
- i. The game must be played with official UPSL match balls which are provided by the home team.
- j. For a weather delay before or during the game, teams are obliged to wait at least 60 minutes for the weather to clear before the referee can call off the game. This is subject to the availability of the facility booking. In the event of lighting failure, or lights not coming on, the visiting team is obliged to wait at least thirty (30) minutes to see if the problem can be rectified. Thereafter, the game will be a forfeit against the home team, as per rule 15.x UNLESS the home team can produce evidence that they were not at fault in which case Rule 11.k below applies. Such evidence must be provided within 48 hours of the incident.
- k. If a game is called off by the Referee due to lightning or any other unforeseeable circumstances not covered elsewhere in these rules, without the possibility of resuming the same day, the following rules will apply in most instances*:

1-40 minutes played: replay from start



41-60 minutes or one half played: replay second half with same score line when game was called off

61 minutes or more played: score stands with no replay.

*if a Game does not reach the above 61 minute threshold, the UPSL Academy Board shall have the authority in determining whether the game should be rescheduled or be considered as a completed game by taking into account unavoidable conditions and/or expenses for both teams. For U13s the minutes in this section are reduced by 5.

12. Minimum Standards

- a. Turf field or quality grass field of minimum dimensions 100 yards length and 58 yards width with markings according to FIFA rules, unless U13 in which case 100 by 50 is the minimum.
- b. Home Team travel sheet submitted to away opponent and Conference Manager Tuesday by 5:00pm for weekend games. For a midweek game, travel sheet must be submitted the prior Saturday by 12pm.
- c. Home team responsible to ensure that the game kicks-off at the exact scheduled time as advertised on the UPSL website.
- d. Home team encouraged and advised to ensure that an athletic trainer is present throughout the match.
- e. 3 UPSL match balls.
- f. 4 corner flags.
- g. 2 benches per team with tents for shade on the opposite side of the field to the spectators.
- h. A table and chair at center field for the 4th official (when utilized).
- i. Onsite restrooms available to players and spectators.
- j. Each team to have home and away kit with distinctly different colors, numbered jerseys and Club logo printed on the jerseys, and the UPSL badge on the left sleeve. The home team is required to wear the color of kit indicated on the home travel sheet.
- k. The visiting team must travel with both away and home jerseys in order to be prepared to resolve a color clash.
- l. UPSL can impose fines of \$50 for each occurrence of a minimum standard violation.



13. Referees

- a. Referee assignment shall be conducted by the UPSL using local designated referee assignors and requiring referees with a minimum Grassroots License (formerly Grades 9, 8, 7).
- b. A 3-man referee crew shall be present at each UPSL Academy game.
- c. The Referee will have the authority to make all decisions pertaining to the game. He/she will follow FIFA Laws of the Game, *except* where there have been modifications made by the UPSL in these Rules.
- d. UPSL referees must be present at any UPSL Academy sanctioned match or said match will be postponed for a later date. Under no circumstances will a match be played without an official referee crew assigned by the respective UPSL Assignor.
- e. The Referee will inspect the playing pitch before the commencement of the match. If he/she decides that a field is unsafe for the players, the game will be abandoned and both teams notified.
- f. The referee fees are expected to be approx. \$210-250 per game to be divided equally between the home and away teams.
- g. Fees are to be paid via Venmo the Tuesday by 8pm prior to a weekend scheduled game or Saturday by 12pm prior to a midweek scheduled game. Late fees of \$30 will be incurred if it's not paid on time.
- h. The final opportunity to make the referee payment, including the \$30 late fee, will be Thursday by 8pm for a weekend game or Sunday by 8pm for a midweek game, otherwise the referees will be cancelled, the offending team will forfeit the match, and will be fined according to the UPSL Academy Rules.
- i. If the referees arrive at the field, or are in transit, they will be paid, even if the game is cancelled or interrupted UNLESS

(1) If a game is cancelled for non-weather-related reasons more than 48 hours before scheduled kick off. Once the 48-hour deadline is passed, this is not allowed.

(2) If a game is cancelled more than two hours before kickoff for weather related reasons and the referees are informed in a timely fashion.



14. Scheduling

- a. A draft season schedule will be provided to teams by the Division Manager no later than 28 days prior to the start date of the season for that Division. The teams will have a window of opportunity to request adjustments before the final schedule is published.
- b. A final schedule will be provided to teams by the Division Manager no later than 21 days prior to the start of the season for that Division.
- c. The home team is responsible for scheduling the venue and the start time for all the home games and providing the information to the Division Manager for inclusion in the published schedule.
- d. No matches are to be scheduled prior to 10am unless the visiting club agrees.
- e. All matches must be scheduled to end 30 minutes prior to sunset unless the visiting club agrees AND lights are provided at the facility for the full duration of the match and until 30 minutes after the game is scheduled to end.
- f. All clubs are expected to schedule matches with professionalism and goodwill, meaning not to place any club at a competitive advantage or disadvantage.
- g. All matches played on the same day are expected to be played at the same facility, and consecutively, unless the visiting club agrees to multiple facilities being utilized, and/or concurrent timing.
- h. Clubs seeking approval for a fixture change must first obtain agreement for the change from the opponent and then must submit an emailed Game Change Approval Request to the UPSL Division or Conference Manager at least ten (10) days prior to the match in question. The Division/Conference Manager has the discretion to grant or deny the request.
- i. Game Change requests within 10 days of the scheduled time are not normally allowed and the opposing team is under no obligation to accept such changes. Game Change Requests may be accepted after the ten (10) day period if there are extenuating circumstances, but should be accompanied by required supporting evidence, be acceptable to both teams, and must comply or be compatible with any procedures and rules relating to referee assignment.
- j. Games postponed within 24 hours of kickoff, owing to inclement weather or unplayable fields, or called off during a game if a replay is required (see 11j), should be promptly rescheduled via consultation between representatives of the respective teams along with the Division Manager. The Division Manager is responsible for ensuring the published schedule is updated. If agreement is not reached within 5 days, the rescheduling of



the postponed game will be determined by the Conference Manager and must be accepted by both teams.

- k. If the last game of a regular season, or a playoff game, is postponed or interrupted for any reason, or called off by the referee as per 10.3, and the playoff calendar does not have time available for the rescheduling of the game, the UPSL Executive Committee will make an unbiased decision as to the appropriate outcome.

15. Forfeiture of Matches, Refusal to Play and Postponement.

- a. Where a team is subject to a forfeit the following penalties will apply:
 - Loss of game 0-3 (or score prevailing if in game and preferable to opponent)
 - Deduction of 3 additional points
 - Fine of \$500
 - Payment of Referee fees if applicable
- b. A Club will forfeit a game in the following circumstances:
 - (i) Refusing to continue a game for a period of greater than ten (10) minutes, walking off the field, or engaging in tactics to abort the game (forfeit to opponent will be 3-0, or whatever the score prevailing at the time if that is preferable to the opponent).
 - (ii) Appearing at a game with less than nine (9) eligible players.
 - (iii) If a Club's supporters, player/s or officials initiate an act responsible for the abrupt end to the game (forfeit to opponent will be 3-0, or whatever the score prevailing at the time if that is preferable to the opponent).
 - (iv) The team arrives fifteen (15) minutes after the scheduled kick-off time, unless the referee and opposing team reach agreement that there exists a legitimate reason to delay the kick-off or reschedule. Once the game commences, this rule cannot apply.
 - (v) Fielding an illegal player or coach, that being one who is not properly registered, transferred, not on the roster or is currently suspended (forfeit to opponent will be 3-0, or whatever the final score if that is preferable to the opponent)
 - (vi) Cancelling a game within 10 days of kick off without a good reason that is acceptable to the opponent and the Division Manager (inclement weather is considered acceptable).



- (vii) When a player or club official refuses to leave the field of play and team area after a red card, resulting in the referee ending the game.
 - (viii) When unauthorized personnel without credentials refuse to leave the bench area for a period greater than ten minutes, resulting in the referee ending the game.
 - (ix) If a field that is booked for the game, in the opinion of the referee, does not meet the minimum standards for field size and condition unless both the visiting team, and the referee, agrees to play the game regardless.
 - (x) If the home team does not have a valid permit or lease for the facility and for the required amount of time to complete a scheduled game, including lights if necessary.
 - (xi) Failure to pay the referee fees ahead of the game and on time resulting in a cancellation of the game (see section 13).
- c. Any Club forfeiting a game where the game is not played will be charged with any referee expenses incurred by the opposing Club.
 - d. The UPSL has the right to postpone any league game in the event of unforeseen circumstances.
 - e. If a game is called off by the referee due to lightning, or any other unforeseeable circumstances not covered elsewhere in these rules, rules 11j and 14j apply.

16. Protests and Appeals

Protests

- a. There are only two (2) acceptable causes for protesting a game after it has been played. They are:
 - (i) A team plays an unregistered, ineligible, or suspended player,
 - (ii.) There has been an obvious error made in the application of the Laws of the Game that directly affects the outcome of the game except involving matters of referee judgment which cannot be protested at any time.
- b. Protests emanating from a game must be registered on the referee's game report by informing the referee immediately after the game in question and followed by a formal letter by email within thirty-six (36) business hours to the relevant conference or division manager.
- c. In order for the formal protest letter to be reviewed by the League, the Club must pay a \$200 filing fee. **The filing fee will be refunded if the protest is successful, less a \$30 administration fee.** The formal protest letter submitted to the League should be detailed and must specify the reasons for the



protest. The letter must also reference the Rule allegedly contravened by the opposing party.

Appeals

- d. A Club or player wishing to appeal any disciplinary action or fine must submit the Appeal to the League along with a \$200 filing fee. The filing fee will be refunded if the Club wins the appeal, less a \$30 administration fee.
 - i. In the event of an appeal, the suspension and/or fine will remain in place until a final decision is made by the Appeals Committee. If found against the player, coach or club, the suspension will be served, even if carried over into the next season. No appeals are allowed for double yellow cards which require a one game suspension.
 - ii. For an appeal to be allowed it must be requested within 7 days of receipt of a disciplinary report, or minimum standards fine.
 - iii. If an appeal fee is unpaid after 5 business days of delivery the appeal will be cancelled.
- e. All appeals and cases of misconduct will be reviewed by the USPL Appeals Committee. This committee is comprised of an independent group of individuals that are not part of the UPSL's Youth Board or Administrative team.

17. Rule Amendments

- a. These UPSL Academy Rules may be reviewed, varied, amended and/or changed by the UPSL Academy Board from time to time either to change existing Rules, or to add new ones, or to incorporate changes ordered by FIFA or USSF.
- b. Any changes, variations and/or amendments made will take immediate effect. The League will ensure that any changes are adequately communicated to all UPSL Academy Clubs.
- c. Any incident or occurrence which is not adequately covered by the rules, regulations, standards and code of conduct herein (including the interpretation of language) will be adjudicated by the UPSL Executive Committee utilizing the rules of FIFA and the US Soccer Federation, and common sense. The UPSL Executive Committee has the full authority to apply this rule to resolve any such unforeseen circumstance.
